

THE HOLY MARTYR THEKLA, EQUAL TO THE APOSTLES

St. Thekla, whom we commemorate today, was born in Iconium in Asia Minor into a poor family. At age 18, she was converted to Christ by the preaching of St. Paul. Rather than marrying, she became a traveling missionary (sometimes traveling with St. Paul). She suffered much hardship but saved many souls. She was eventually martyred in Syria on September 24th, date unknown. She is honored with the title of "Equal to the Apostles" because of how many were saved through her ministry.

THE HOLY NORTH AMERICAN MARTYRS JUVENALY THE PRIEST AND PETER THE ALEUT

St. Juvenaly came to Alaska from Russia in 1794 along with St. Herman. He was so energetic in converting Alaskans to Christ that St. Herman said he was "almost like a madman wanting to rush off in all directions". Many were brought to God and Holy Baptism in his incessant travels. His death came when he encountered a hunting party of the Yupik tribe who were opposed to the new religion of Christianity. They killed Father Juvenaly with arrows and spears as he stood in his boat and blessed them with the sign of the cross. His martyrdom took place in 1796.

St. Peter was an Aleut native converted to Christ by Russian missionaries. He himself became a missionary to natives as far south as northern California. He was arrested by the Spanish authorities and imprisoned in San Francisco. They said they would kill him if he did not convert to Roman Catholicism. He refused even though they cut off all his fingers joint by joint in an attempt to convince him. After much more torture, he died. His martyrdom took place in 1815.

WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR BRINGING KIDS TO CHURCH:

Walk to icons around the sides and the back of the church for a break. Try to only exit to the narthex if necessary and even then, hold the child and direct their attention through the windows into the church.

RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION IN TONE SEVEN (p. 15)

Thou didst shatter death by Thy Cross, Thou didst open paradise to the thief; Thou didst turn the sadness of the ointment-bearing women into joy. And didst bid Thine Apostles proclaim a warning, that Thou hast risen O Christ, granting to the world the Great Mercy.

APOLYTIKION OF ST. THEKLA THE PROTO-MARTYR IN TONE THREE

(By Cyril, Patriarch of Constantinople, 1813)

O glorious Thekla, companion of Paul the divine, you were enflamed with the love of your Creator, by the teaching of the divine preacher. You despised the passing earthly pleasures, and offered yourself to God as an acceptable and pleasing sacrifice, disregarding all suffering. Intercede with Christ your Groom to grant us His Great Mercy.

APOLYTIKION OF ST. SILOUAN THE ATHONITE IN TONE FOUR

By prayer thou didst receive Christ as thy teacher in the way of humility, and the Spirit bore witness to salvation in thy heart. Wherefore, all peoples called unto hope rejoice in this day of thy memorial, O sacred Father Silouan. Pray unto Christ our God for the salvation of our souls.

APOLYTIKION OF ST. MATTHEW THE EVANGELIST IN TONE THREE (p. 16)

With zeal you followed Christ the Master, Who in His goodness appeared to men on earth. He called you from the custom house, revealing you to be a chosen apostle, a trumpet proclaiming the Gospel to the whole world! Therefore, divinely eloquent Matthew, we honor your precious memory. Entreat the merciful God, that He may grant us remission of our sins.

ORDINARY KONTAKION IN TONE TWO (p. 17)

O protection of Christians that cannot be put to shame, mediation unto the Creator most constant, O despise not the suppliant voices of those who have sinned; but be thou quick, O good one, to come unto our aid, who in faith cry unto thee: Hasten to intercession, and speed thou to make supplication, thou who dost ever protect, O Theotokos, them that honor thee.

God is wondrous among His saints. Bless ye God in the congregations.

The Reading from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to St. Timothy. (3:10-15)

Timothy, my son, you have observed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, my persecutions, my sufferings, what befell me at Antioch, at Iconium, and at Lystra. What persecutions I endured! Yet from them all, the Lord rescued me. Indeed, all, who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, while evil men and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceivers and deceived. But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

THE GOSPEL (For the First Sunday of Luke)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke. (5:1-11)

At that time, Jesus was standing by the lake of Genesaret. And He saw two boats by the lake; but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, Jesus asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when Jesus had finished speaking, He said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at Thy word I will let down the nets." And when they had done this, they enclosed a great shoal of fish; and as their nets were breaking, they beckoned to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." For he was astonished, and all that were with him, at the catch of fish, which they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; henceforth you will be catching men." And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed Him.

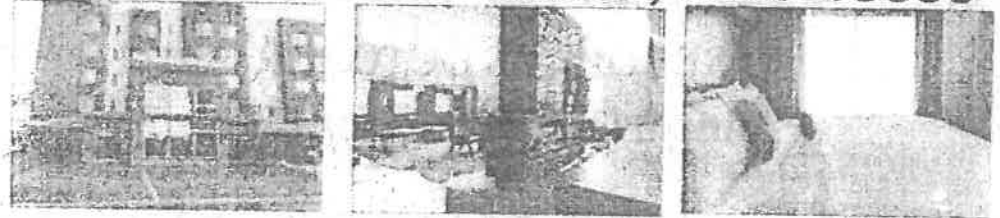



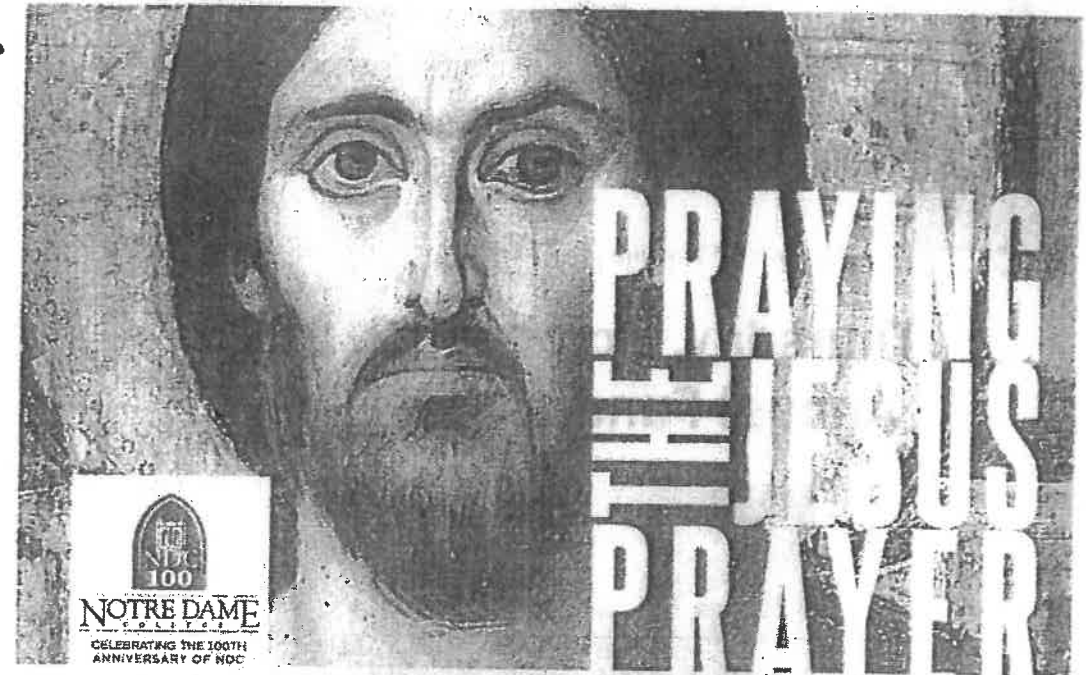
