Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving Him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. And He said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."

ST. MAXIMUS THE CONFESSOR

St. Maximos was chief secretary to the Byzantine Emperor in the 600's A.D. He left all that behind to become a monk and for some years a hermit. He achieved great holiness and wrote very important works of theology which we still have today. When the Monothelite heresy became strong (because pushed by the Emperor) St. Maximus stood up against it. This heresy asserted that Christ had no human will---and so was not really truly a man. The pope of Rome, Martin (Rome was Orthodox back then) also went against this heresy and was imprisoned and later died due to poor conditions there. St. Maximos was called before a special synod of bishops who attempted to get him to go along with the new heresy. He refused and was punished by whipping, and the cutting off of his tongue and right hand. He was sent into exile under very difficult conditions and finally fell asleep in Christ in 662 A.D. *(More on this Saint in today's sermon)*
