

APOLYTIKION OF THE THEOPHANY IN TONE ONE

The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord. O God, hear my prayer.

The Reading from the Acts of the Apostles. (19:1-8)

In those days, while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul passed through the upper country and came to Ephesus. There he found some disciples. And he said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" And they said, "No, we have never even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." And he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They said, "Into John's baptism." And Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the One Who was to come after him, that is, Jesus." On hearing this, they were baptized in the Name of the Lord Jesus. And when Paul had laid his hands upon them, the Holy Spirit came on them; and they spoke with tongues and prophesied. There were about twelve of them in all. And he entered the synagogue and for three months spoke boldly, arguing and pleading about the Kingdom of God.

At that time, John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, Who takes away the sin of the world! This is He of Whom I said, 'After me comes a man Who ranks before me, for He was before me.' I myself did not know Him; but for this I came baptizing with water, that He might be revealed to Israel." And John bore witness, "I saw the Spirit descend as a dove from heaven, and it remained on Him. I myself did not know Him; but He Who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on Whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is He Who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God."



THE HOLY PROPHET, FORERUNNER, AND BAPTIZER JOHN

Today, January 7th, is one of quite a few holy days on which we honor St. John the Baptist. We honor him so often because our Orthodox Tradition clearly believes him to be the most important holy human who has ever lived except for our Lord Jesus Christ and the Holy Theotokos. That is why his icon is in the third place of honor (after Christ and St. Mary on iconostases), and why when Saints' intercessions are asked for at the end of worship services, he is the second Saint asked (after the Theotokos).

Today he is especially commemorated (on January 7th, the Synaxis of St. John) because this is the day after Theophany when he did the amazingly wonderful thing of baptizing God the Son, Jesus Christ, in the Jordan River.

THEOPHANY HOME BLESSINGS ARE STARTING TODAY----

January 2, 2024

Good morning! Christ is born! I hope you are having a joyous 12 Days—we are now on the 9th day. I am writing about the blessing of homes this year. The most common time to do them is in between Theophany on January 6th and the start of Great Lent (March 18th this year). And they are also rather frequently done at other times of the year, although not commonly in Lent.

My usual practice has been to attempt to bless each parishioner's home before Lent---and up until about a couple of years ago, I usually came pretty close to succeeding. But last year, (and somewhat in 2021) it wasn't possible due to more homes---a wonderful problem! So some got done later in the year and, unfortunately, some didn't get done.

This year, the crunch has gotten more severe. Two reasons-----First---more homes than ever before: well over 200 homes to bless counting parishioners (including quite a few shut-ins), catechumens, frequent attenders, etc. And to really make it impossible to do it all before Lent is the fact that Khourie Bonnie and I will be in Taiwan for over 3 weeks right smack in the middle of houseblessing season (Jan. 29 through February 20) to see our son, Christopher, his wife Yun, and our new granddaughter, Xenia.

So....I am planning on using the following priorities, breaking the homes into 3 categories of priority.

First, I will start by blessing homes of the shut-ins, and people who are either new to the parish and so have never had a home blessing or who have new dwelling places not yet blessed.

Second, then I will bless homes of people whose homes were not blessed last year.

Third, then I will bless homes of people whose homes were blessed in 2023 and would like to have them blessed again this year.

I don't think I can get them all done, even though I can do some after Pascha up until whatever point in the summer my retirement goes into effect. Because the parish has grown quite a bit my pastoring work has become much busier than before, meaning that the time available for blessing homes has decreased.....but I will do all that I can.

ALSO A NOTE CONCERNING REFRESHMENTS-----My doctor has banned sweets for me and also discourages salty food, so please obey him! I will try to do that, too! Just coffee or water is fine! Meals are fun, of course, but time (and health!) don't allow many......If you do wish me to have a meal with you, please let me know ahead of time---440-539-1116 fatherharmon@outlook.com

Thanks be to Christ who lowered Himself to be baptized in the Jordan River for our salvation. I look forward to celebrating that with you in your home!
