Reflections on the retreat with Fr. Josiah Trenham:

This September, we were blessed to have the Very Reverend Father Josiah Trenham visit us and lead a wonderful retreat on Godly Marriage and Virginity. Fr. Josiah is known as a Godly man and a gifted speaker, and his visit fully demonstrated both. He relayed much wisdom and quite a few personal anecdotes, including a Cleveland connection he has through his beloved Deacon Elie Khouri. He concluded his weekend by celebrating Divine Liturgy with us and giving a powerful Homily on the need for evangelization.

As you would expect, there were long lines to speak with Fr. Josiah after each session, and everyone went away inspired and enriched. It was easily the biggest retreat that we've ever hosted at St. Matthew's, with large numbers of people at each session and some coming from as far as Canada! Thank you to all who attended and helped make this retreat possible. May God continue to bestow His blessings on our parish and our family!

Ginger DeFilippo wrote: "The retreat with Fr Trenham was fantastic. He was dynamic and spoke with such imagery I felt transported. He helped me see the beauty of God's original design for marriage and humanity - the harmony and glory that existed before the fall, the brokenness from the fall, then the hope he offered by showing me how Christ came to restore and elevate marriage into something beautiful, filled with divine grace. He taught from the scriptures and brought in the church Fathers and Saints reinforcing his lessons on marriage. It was incredible. At the end of every lesson, and including church on Sunday, he spoke to everyone waiting in line, answering questions and was so very personable. He is truly a very caring and loving priest and it was an honor to have him at our retreat and church."

Review of Our Trip to Father Paul Abernathy's Church-St Moses the Black - October 5th

On Saturday, October 5th, a group from our parish, led by Father Fred and Deacon Basil, visited St. Moses the Black Orthodox Church in the Hill District of Pittsburgh, pastored by Father Paul Abernathy. The group consisted of the teen group, a few adults, and clergy, totaling 20 people. We met at our church at 7 AM, where we carpooled in three vehicles driven by Father Fred, Deacon Basil, and Vinny DeFilippo, setting off for Pittsburgh at 7:30 AM.

Along the way, we made a stop at the home of Rick and Deema Esper, who graciously hosted us for breakfast. Deema prepared a delicious spread of fresh fruit, bagels, eggs, ham, lox with cream cheese, nuts, coffee, freshly squeezed orange juice, and more. After enjoying this wonderful meal, we departed around 10:30 AM and arrived at St. Moses the Black.

Upon our arrival, we were welcomed by SubDeacon Bizrat, who gave us a tour of the church and its facilities. St. Moses the Black is part of a three-story building that serves the local community in multiple ways. The building houses a free medical and dental clinic, with two exam rooms and two dental rooms staffed by volunteer doctors and dentists. The Neighborhood Resilience Project, which operates from the top floor, provides essential services and support to the area. They even have two medical emergency vehicles that are dispatched during emergencies, often arriving on the scene before local authorities. It's truly a remarkable ministry.

Beneath the church is a food pantry and a clothing distribution area for those in need. Our group of 20 gathered here and worked together to assemble nearly 1,000 food bags for school children who rely on these meals over the weekends. The church distributes approximately 1,300 bags weekly to support the community.

After our volunteer efforts, we gathered on the top floor where Father Paul Abernathy spoke to the group about the deep needs within the neighborhood. He emphasized how placing altars in impoverished areas across the country could reduce crime and spread Orthodoxy. It was an inspiring message that truly resonated with us all.

We ended the day with pizza before joining in evening vespers. After vespers, we said our goodbyes and headed back home, arriving at St. Matthew's around 9:30 PM.

The trip brought the words of Christ to life:

"For I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in" (Matthew 25:35).

Father Paul Abernathy's ministry beautifully embodies this call to serve the poor and the needy. Through our small efforts, we were able to witness firsthand the mercy, love, and support that Christ calls us to extend to our neighbors, especially those in need.

It was an incredible time filled with service, fellowship, and a deep sense of purpose, leaving us all inspired to continue helping those in need, both spiritually and physically.

We are grateful to Rt Rev Archimandrite Jeremy for his visit to us on Oct 11-13 as part of his ministry as the Archepiscopal Vicar of the Diocese of Toledo and the Midwest.
