PARISH MINISTRY TEAM UPDATE

To bring you up to date on this program that started a few months ago: as of now, **20 lay ministry teams are in existence**. However, **4 of them definitely need more volunteers to fully function**--these 4 teams are: Social Fellowship, Worship, Children's Ministry, Parish Library. And there **are 2 teams we wish to have start, but no one has volunteered yet.** These 2 are: Potluck Meal Coordination (this team would not coordinate all the meals, but find coordinators for each meal); Altar Guild (this team would take care altar boy robes, altar cloths, etc.). The other **16 teams do have enough volunteers and leadership to now be under way---**but if you would like to help on them, you can still sign up! *To see all the teams listed, and to sign up-----please see the little charts near the water fountain in the hall.*

AT THE AKATHIST SERVICES ON FRIDAYS IN LENT, THE THEOTOKOS IS REFERRED TO IN THE HYMNS AS THE "BRIDE WITHOUT BRIDEGROOM". ON SUNDAY, MONDAY, & TUESDAY NIGHTS OF HOLY WEE, WE HAVE THE "BRIDEGROOM SERVICES". WHAT IS THE RELATION BETWEEN THE TWO?

Actually, there is no relation here---just the use in two different contexts of the same word, "bridegroom". In the Akathist service, the phrase "Bride Without Bridegroom" refers to the fact that St. Mary gave birth to Christ through a virgin conception and birth—no man, no "bridegroom", was involved.

The Bridegroom services on Sunday, Monday, & Tuesday nights of Holy Week focus quite a bit on the Second Coming of Christ at the end of the world. The term "bridegroom" is used here to refer to Jesus Christ, taken from a parable the Lord told about His Second Coming in Matthew 25:1-13. In this parable and in these services, Christ is referred to as the Bridegroom who comes back at the end of time to be mystically married to His Bride, the Church. In these beautiful services, the "Bridegroom icon" is put in the center of the church. This icon, also known as the "icon of deep humility", shows Christ in the midst of His sufferings before His crucifixion----He has been stripped of His clothing, whipped, and the crown of thorns is on His head which is humbly bowed. While we, in the Bridegroom Services, sing and read bout Christ's glorious Second Coming as King and Ruler of all, we gaze upon this icon of His suffering, remembering how it is one and the same Man who suffered in Holy Week and who will one day come back in majestic glory.

AGAPE VESPERS READERS NEEDED

At Agape Vespers at noon on Pascha Day, it is customary to have the gospel lesson read by different lay people in different languages. If you can be one of the readers, please let Father Andrew know.
